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PRESENTING A PERSUASIVE SPEECH

What Is Persuasion?
Persuasion means trying to make people believe in an idea or opinion.
We use persuasion frequently. Persuasion can be visual, spoken or written.

Decide if these are persuasive examples.	
An advertisement on YouTube Ads selling a brand new snack.	Persuasive
A novel about a teenager who is sailing alone to Antarctica.	Not Persuasive
A blog post about an amazing new theme park and how good the rides are.	Persuasive
A teenager giving her parents reasons for why she should be allowed to sleepover at her friend's place.	Persuasive
A report about how much rubbish is in the local river.	Not Persuasive
A letter to the principal asking to build a new playground.	Persuasive

What Is a Persuasive Speech?
Persuasive speeches share the speaker's point of view or opinion with an audience. It includes an opinion and arguments (reasons). We use strong language to convince the reader that our opinion is the right one.

Persuasive Speech Examples
(Pick 1 one or two.)

How to Write a Persuasive Speech
A persuasive speech needs:
An introduction that includes a hook to get the audience's attention, the writer's opinion, and also states the reasons why they think that.
Two (or three) arguments or reasons why you think that.
Supporting facts, explanations and/or examples to support your reasons.
A conclusion to remind the audience of your opinion and leave them something to think about.

Write a Persuasive Speech
You are going to write a Persuasive Speech to persuade people to save water and/or keep water in the environment clean.

Let's Get Writing
Today you are going to begin writing the draft of your persuasive speech.

Let's Get Writing Writing Your Introduction
We'll look at how to:
- Write a hook.
- State your point of view.

Here's a Persuasive Speech Introduction Example:
Hook → Imagine a world without homework. No more late nights of not getting enough sleep. Follow that thought: There should be no homework, especially in primary school.

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The Journey of Two Little Water Drops
(Reader's Theatre)

The Sun: Our story starts in the ocean. We are watching two drops of water.

Ocean Water Drop 1: It's getting hot here in the ocean - I don't think I can swim any more. I'm feeling light and airy! I think the Sun's doing it to me.

The Sun: I can't help it - I'm hot and full of energy. That's what I do, and I do it so well, don't I?

Ocean Water Drop 2: Yes, you do, but I think I'm getting dizzy and there isn't even a whirlpool ("wɜːl-puːl") here. I'm feeling so strange! I think I'll just float for a while - no more swimming for me.

Ocean Water Drop 1: Uh oh! You're not floating in the water anymore, you're floating in the air - you're not a drop of water either - you're water vapour ("væp-ər") now.

Water Vapour 1: What's water vapour ("væp-ər")?

Water Vapour 2: It's water, but it's a gas. You've evaporated ("e-vəp-ər-ey-tid") and turned into a gas - and so have I. Let's fly up high!

Water Vapour 1: I feel like joining the others and forming a crowd.

Water Vapour 2: I think you mean a cloud, not a crowd. Okay, let's condense ("kən-dens").

Water Vapour 1: What does that mean?

Water Vapour 2: Condensing ("kən-dens-ing") means that we'll change back into a liquid ("lik-wid") (water, of course). Then we'll be part of a cloud.

Cloud: Okay, now we're a beautiful, fluffy cloud. Let's fly over the land and watch the goats. Take a look at those beautiful mountains! But now I'm feeling heavy and cold. I think I'm going to snow!

Snowflake 1: Hey, what's got six arms and there's nothing exactly like it in the whole world?

Snowflake 2: Me - I'm so special. You, too, of course. We're both snowflakes. Hey, where are you going now?

Snowflake 1: I can't stop falling - you're falling too. But where are we going?

Write a story about the water cycle.

- Write a story with water as the main character. You can start off as a water drop, or a snowflake, or a raindrop, or any form of water. Some examples that might inspire you: *The Magic School Bus - Wet All Over* <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2a2t4vWk8> and *Ice Boy* by David Ezra Stein <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1M13p0k>
- Choose a setting for the beginning of your story. You may start at any stage of the water cycle.
- There must be a problem in the story. Perhaps the water drop sees how water is being misused. Perhaps something scary happens to the snowflake, etc.
- All the stages of the water cycle must be included in your story.
- End with a solution to the problem.

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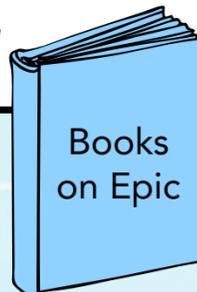


Stages of the Water Cycle Charades

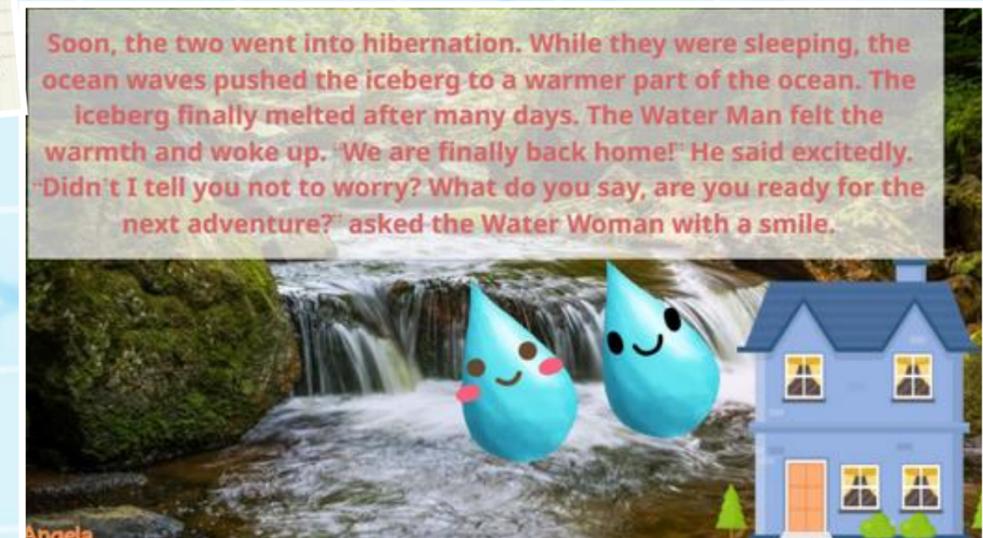

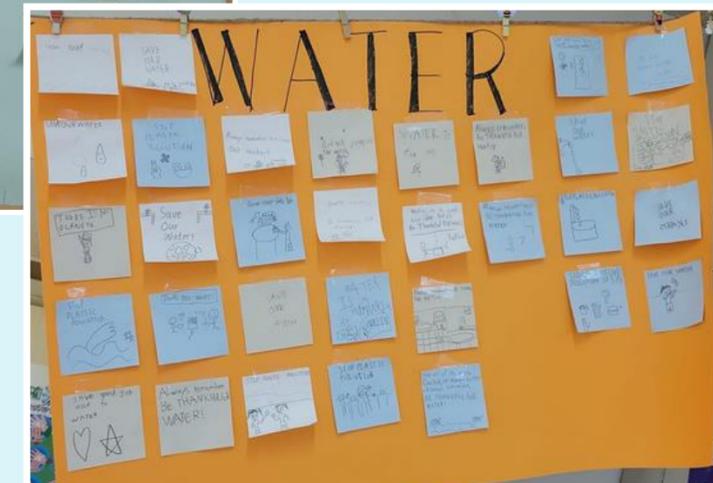
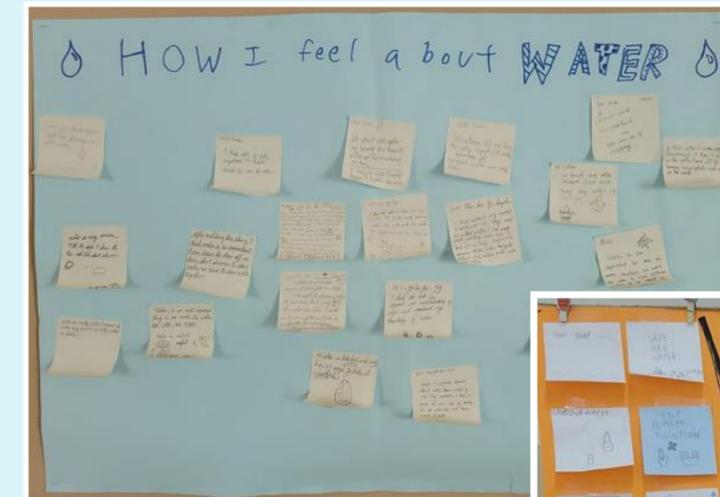
WHOLE-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

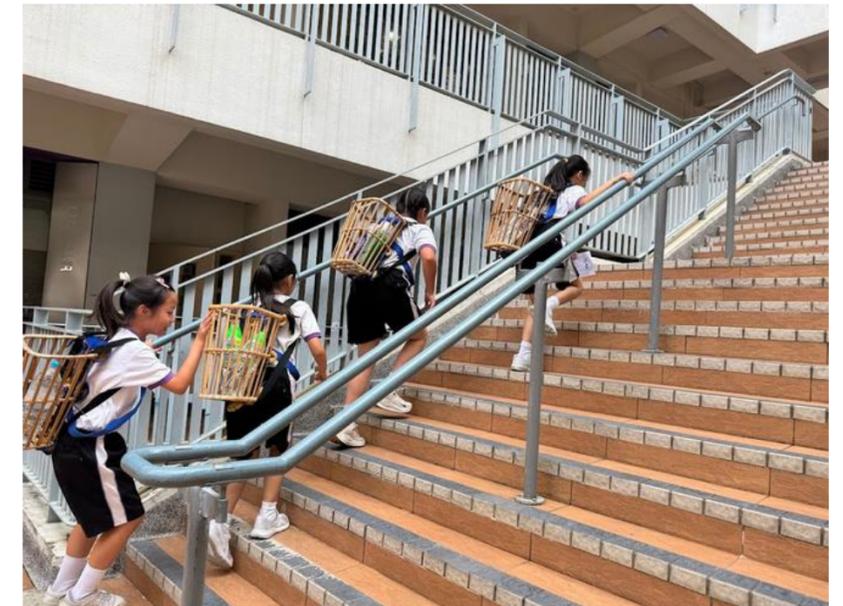

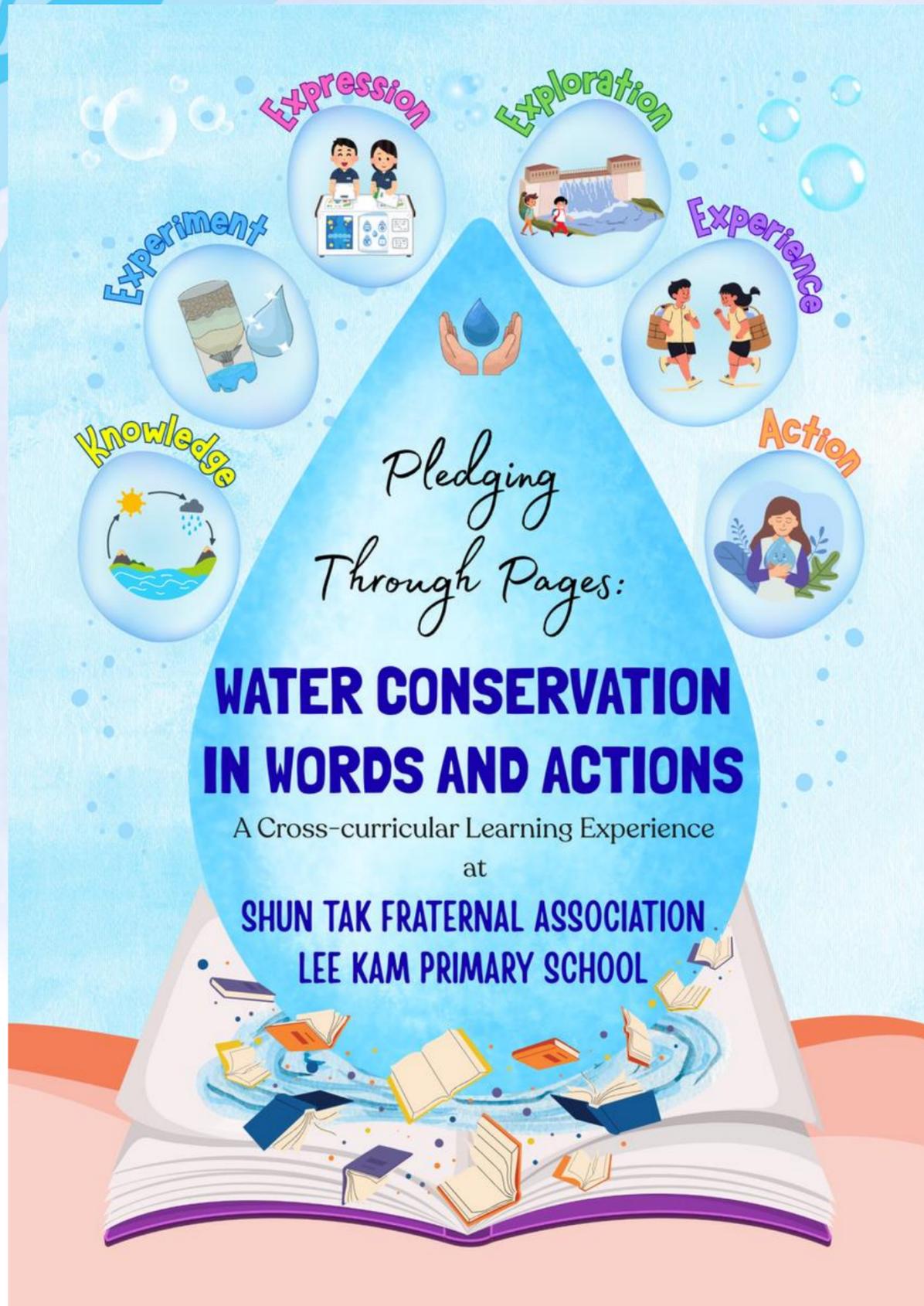
