THE THINK PLANNING FRAMEWORK

Teachers were introduced to the THINK Planning Framework, a structured approach to embedding thinking tools meaningfully:

T – Theme

H – Higher-Order Thinking Skills

I – Intercultural Understanding

N – Navigation

K – Knowledge of English Language
