Introduction

At this event, three schools showcased inspiring literacy strategies, while attending teachers actively participated in discussions, exchanged ideas, and gained fresh insights from peers across different schools. Developing AI generated decodable texts

The school introduced their innovative approach to creating decodable texts for Primary 1 students using AI tools. By designing customised graphics and text, they developed books tailored to students' phonics knowledge and reading levels. These visually engaging and interactive texts allowed students to practice specific sounds and words in a fun and effective way, building strong foundational reading skills. To inspire others, the school also shared a step-by-step tutorial on how to create these AI-generated decodable texts, making this strategy accessible to all teachers.



Creating authentic reading materials

The second school showcased their approach to developing authentic reading materials designed to guide students through research tasks. These materials were thoughtfully crafted to help students gather information on specific topics, fostering engagement and deeper learning. The research process culminated in a meaningful writing task, allowing teachers to assess students' comprehension, critical thinking, and ability to synthesise information into coherent written work. Additionally, the school shared the tools they used to review their whole-school English curriculum, ensuring alignment with EDB initiatives.

Project-based learning

The final school showcased their project-based learning approach, where students explored the topic of endangered animals. Through online research, students gathered information, developed comprehension skills, and summarised their findings into persuasive presentations. This process enabled students to practise critical reading, summarisation, and persuasive writing, while also fostering a deeper awareness of global environmental issues and the importance of conservation.



Connecting Reading to Broader Literacy Goals

Reading is just one aspect of English language education, encompassing a wide range of skills such as phonics, vocabulary building, comprehension, critical thinking, and summarisation. The three schools highlighted how their diverse approaches—creating decodable texts, using authentic materials for guided research, and implementing project-based learning—interwove these strands to cultivate both foundational and higher-order reading skills. Together, these strategies demonstrated how reading instruction can extend beyond decoding to connect with broader literacy goals, making it a dynamic and essential part of English education.
