

VALUES IN ACTION





This event served as an invaluable platform for educators to delve into the latest updates from the Education Bureau (EDB) on VE. Participants enriched their understanding of how to authentically incorporate VE into English language learning and teaching and analyse their school contexts to develop actionable plans for integrating VE into the English Language curriculum. Throughout the event, educators engaged in meaningful connections, exchanged insights and shared best practices for integrating VE into their lessons.
